

Keep Metro stations clean: Keshav

Tobacco products recovered from commuters during frisking

During the frisking of commuters on station premises, LMRC officials recovered nearly 20 kg tobacco products like gutka, paan masala, cigarettes etc in the last two days. The material confiscated will be disposed in a safe manner.

LMRC managing director Kumar Keshav said he was thankful to all Metro commuters for their cooperation towards frisking and keeping Lucknow Metro a neat and clean medium of transport.

"Lucknow Metro is a green and environment-friendly public transport and it is our duty to keep it neat and clean. The efforts of LMRC and people will help in keeping Metro always a nice, beautiful and clean public transport," Keshav said.

The Metro stations remained bustling with passengers coming from across the city on the second day. Director, Rolling Stock, Mahendra Kumar said the operations on Thursday were smooth. Regarding the train which had developed a techni-

cal snag, he said they were still conducting tests to figure out the reason. "This should not have happened and we are attracting a lot of youngsters," he said.

He added that they were getting the maximum number of passengers at Charbagh and LMRC staff posted at the station said that there was a regular flow of commuters and the maximum amongst those were

between 19 and 35 years of age. "We are getting several passengers from Charbagh railway station coming directly from the side of the station complete with their baggages," he said.

A majority of them said that among the other facilities which they wanted at the stations was the provision of food and beverages.

Senior LMRC PRO Amit Srivastava said that after getting the feedback, they would take

consider what kind of facilities could be added.

Regarding the provision of food and beverages at Lucknow Metro stations, he said, "Now that Metro has started operations and footfalls are increasing on the stations, vendors will come forward for that."

Meanwhile, SP (Traffic) Ravi Shankar Nim said on Thursday that Lucknow Metro would have an impact on traf-

fic in the coming days and there would be lesser traffic snarls. "Traffic will ease once people get used to the Metro," he added. Asked if traffic at Charbagh was affected, he said that the snarls continued because of roadways buses.

Charbagh crossing faces traffic snarls primarily because of the buses and the problem remains as it was, but we are hoping that things will get better," he added.

39 more diagnosed with swine flu, city tally climbs to 1,905

As many as 39 fresh cases of swine flu and three of dengue were reported from different parts of the city on Thursday. With this the total number of swine flu cases touched the alarming figure of 1,905 and those of dengue 55.

According to recent reports, three dengue patients, Jyoti Chaurasia (29), a resident of Mohanlalgarh, and Anika Mishra, a resident of Chintia Khedha, Aishbagh, were admitted to the St Joseph's Hospital and Queen Mary's Hospital while the third patient, Amit Kumar Srivastava, is hale and hearty now. Earlier among the 39 cases reported from the city a large number of patients were provided medicines at their homes and four patients were being treated at private hospi-



tals like Sahara Hospital, Mayo Hospital and Avadh Hospital. The patients, including Dr RP Dwivedi, a resident of Vinay Khand, LG Dubey, a resident of Vinay Khand, Krishna Gopal Mishra, a resident of Krishna Nagar, and Shebhechu, a resident of United South City Garden, were being treated at these hospitals. The other swine flu cases were reported from Rajni

Khand, Sharda Nagar, Rae Bareilly Road, Kanpur Road, Manak Nagar, Telibagh, Khedha Para, Kanha Nagar Colony, Kakori, Pripasand, Rajajipuram, SSB, Gomti Nagar, Kamta, Chinihat, Vikas Nagar, Jankipuram, Naubasta and other adjoining areas.

Meanwhile the team of the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) continuing its vector-borne disease control programme reached 101 wards across the city. On the occasion the team carrying out the anti-mosquito larva chemical sprinkling had covered 185 mohallas so far. Under this drive it inspected 2,202 houses and 937 coolers. On Thursday the team visited 13 places and issued notices to 11 house-owners for violating the mosquito breeding preventive norms. It re-inspected eight places here.

Yogi wants legislators to spread good work of government

In an innovative method to improve communication, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath made ministers as head of different core groups of legislators, asking them to educate the latter about the positives of their departments so that the message of good work done by the government could be disseminated.

"The basic aim of the Yogi government is to ensure that benefits of government schemes reach bonafide beneficiaries. This should not be limited to papers only. Legislators and senior BJP leaders should ensure that schemes were implemented up to village level," said Rural Engineering Services Minister Rajendra Pratap Singh alias Moti Singh in a statement issued in Lucknow on Thursday. Singh interacted with members of legislators' core group comprising Minister of State for Basic Education Sandip Singh, Pankaj Gupta (MLA-Unnao), Veer

Vikram Singh (MLA -Katra, Shahajahanpur), Kapil Dev Agarwal (MLA-Muzaffarnagar), Dr Arun Saxena (MLA-Bareilly), Dinesh Chaudhary (MLA - Jaunpur), Anil Kumar Maurya (MLA - Ghorawal, Sonabhadra) and Ram Pal Verma (MLA-Balmara Hardoi) at this office. Members of the core group will now meet people in respective areas and tell people about achievements of the Yogi government. These members also lodged complaints about their constituencies with the RES minister. "This is a two-way communication. The minister tells the core group members about government schemes and, in turn, they could highlight problems of respective departments. This helps in redressing problems," he said. Singh said there had been a vast improvement in the law and order situation and the government was also trying to build infrastructure like roads and electricity supply.

Restaurateur attacked by rivals

An owner of a restaurant was beaten up by his rival group in Gomti Nagar area. He was identified as Amit Sharma as he sustained multiple injuries in the attack on late Wednesday night. An FIR was lodged at the police station by Sharma alleging he was thrashed and his two mobile phone sets and Rs. 10,000 in cash were taken away by the assailants. Sharma is running Oasis near Jaipuria School in Gomti Nagar area for the past one decade. His father Prem Shanker Sharma used to help his son in managing and running the eatery.

The police said that the motive for the incident was the dispute relating to the ownership of restaurant premises. The father was not there when the incident occurred at 1.30 am. The police said that Sharma had closed the restaurant for about 1 am and was engaged in giving the money to his staffers when Naser Syed, along with his business partner Ashish Singh and six others unidentified armed miscreants, barged into the restaurant. Without any provocation, they started hammering him. The restaurant employees initially thought the miscreants had come to commit a robbery. But later it surfaced that they had come to settle a dispute with Sharma.

Sharma sustained serious head injury when one of the culprits threw a brass flower pot at him while leaving the premises. Naser was reportedly making pressure on Sharma for the past one year to sell the premises to him and assured Sharma of handsome amount according to the prevailing market price. Three arrested for lawyer's murder

Three miscreants were arrested for killing 55-year-old lawyer Imran Khan on late Wednesday night near his house located at Tikait Rai colony falling under Bazar Khala police station. They were arrested from different places on Thursday.

SSP Deepak Kumar said that Mohammad Shafiq and Vikas Singh alias Channu were arrested in the few hours of Thursday from Bhusa Mandi crossing in Malwaha area. The police recovered a country-made pistol used in the crime and three live cartridges from their possession.

The third miscreant, identified as Aleem, was picked up for interrogation in the morning near his house in Bazar Khala area and was arrested later in the afternoon after he confessed his involvement in the shooting incident.

The daughter of deceased Sehla Nigar lodged an FIR at Bazar Khala on late Wednesday night alleging her father was shot dead by his neighbour Dharmendra and his associates Mohammad Aleem, Mohammad Shafiq, Baba, Sunil, his son Channu and his mother. Three of them were arrested. The motive for the killing was the garbage dispute. The SSP claimed that



the rest of them would be arrested soon.

Meanwhile, a 25-year old private security guard was strangled to death by unknown miscreants on the premises of Ganga Prasad poultry farm situated in Malhabad area. He was identified as Rama Shanker, son of Munnal Lal, a resident of Rusena village. He was on night duty at the farm house. Mukesh, a neighbour of the deceased, informed his father Munnal Lal on Wednesday night at 1 am that Rama Shanker had died under the mysterious circumstances and his body was found lying on a cot on the premises of the farm house with severe injury mark on his throat. The police said he was strangled to death but failed to state the motive for the killing. The police claimed it would be known after primary investigation. It is said that he was a gambler and also was in the habit of having of drugs as well as liquor.

JOINT COMMITTEE ON THE FINANCIAL RESOLUTION AND DEPOSIT INSURANCE BILL, 2017

The Financial Resolution and Deposit Insurance Bill, 2017 has been referred to a Joint Parliamentary Committee of both the Houses, under the Chairmanship of Shri Bhupender Yadav, M.P., for examination and presenting a Report to the Parliament. The Bill seeks to provide for the resolution of certain categories of financial service providers in distress; the deposit insurance to consumers of certain categories of financial services; designation of systemically important financial institutions; and establishment of a Resolution Corporation for protection of consumers of specified service providers and of public funds for ensuring the stability and resilience of the financial system and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto. The proposed legislation together with the insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016 is expected to provide a comprehensive resolution mechanism for the economy.

2. It has been decided by the Joint Committee to seek views and suggestions from various stakeholders and public at large on the provisions of the aforesaid Bill. "The Financial Resolution and Deposit Insurance Bill, 2017" has been uploaded on Lok Sabha website http://164.100.47.8/lls/Texts/LSBill/Texts/Asintroduced/165_2017_LS_Eng.pdf

3.
