Teacher hangs self in classroom

A teacher of Arts was found hanging inside a classroom of Bharatiya Vidya Bhawan College in Gomti Nagar (Vinit Khand 6) on Saturday night. The incident came to light when he did not reach home and his family called the school authorities who found him locked in a room there. The police claimed that the door of the classroom was locked from inside and was broke open to gain an access.

As per reports, the teacher, identified as Himanshu Murti (30) of Aishbagh locality, was employed at the school for the last few years and taught drawing in junior classes. On Saturday, he left for his workplace but did not return by evening. Apprehensive over this, the family contacted him on his cell phone but he did not reply. "Following this, they called the school authorities who sent a staff to the school to inquire about him. On seeing

his scooty parked inside the school, the staff went to classrooms and found one locked from inside. They knocked the doors and when they did not get any reply, they called the police." Gomti Nagar SHO Devi Prasad Tiwari said.

He said the police reached the scene and broke open the doors only to find Himanshu hanging from the ceiling. "He was hanging with a rope tied around his neck. A suicide note

was recovered from the room," the SHO said.

Himanshu stated in the suicide note: "I am taking the step on my own. Kindly inform my friends about the same." Tiwari said the family members, who also had reached the school, identified that the suicide note was written by Himanshu. "The family failed to explain the reason which caused Himanshu to end his life," the SHO told. The police sent the

body for autopsy and started the investigation into the case. Police suspected that Himanshu took the step due to frustration after he had a break-up with his love interest. The cops probing the case opined that Himanshu would have taken the step after the school was over for the day and he stayed there instead of leaving for his house. "It is beyond comprehension that how he was not spotted by the peon of the school who locked the classrooms after the school was closed for the day," they pointed out.

The Central government's much-awaited 'India Post Payments Bank' was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New Delhi and by Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh in Lucknow. Singh inaugurated the Lucknow branch of India Post Payments Bank by unveiling the plaque. The first five account holders were given away 'QR cards'. A special cover was also released on the occasion.

Speaking about the achievements of the Modi government, Singh said it was moving together with an aim of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas' and India Post Payments Bank would play a significant role in that regard. The Centre has taken the initiative to open bank accounts of the last mile of the society through 650 branches of India Post Payment Bank and 3250 access points across the country. All remaining post offices will be linked by year-end.

The Home Minister said that the postman would play the role of a bank and provide banking services to people living in unbanked areas. He also highlighted schemes such as Sukanya Samridhi Yojana meant for better future of girl child, 'Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao', Atal Pension Yojana, Prime Minister Jeevan Jyoti Yojana and Prime Minister Suraksha Beema Yojana in the post offices.

Also present on the occasion was chief postmaster general (UP) VP Singh, director of postal services (Lucknow) Krishna Kumar Yadav, and director (Headquarters) Rajeev Umrao. Speaking on the occasion, VP Singh said that 73 branches of India Post Payments Bank and 292 access points were being started across the state. "The India Post Payments Bank will work through various means, including counter operations, door-to-door service, mobile & internet banking etc. Singh said that the role of Postal department was changing rapidly.

"The post office is facilitating the needs of people with innovative technology in areas such as savings, insurance and e-commerce. People may now avail benefits of IPPB by getting their post office savings accounts linked with IPPB. In this regard, money from various social security schemes can be directly credited to the beneficiary accounts under the Direct Benefit Transfer scheme. (DBT)," he said.

Krishna Kumar Yadav said that the postmen delivering letters would now come with the mobile app to make true the concept of 'Aapka Bank, Aapke Dwar'.

SGPGI convocation: Beginning of a new learning phase, says Guv

Extending his best wishes to 162 awardees of DM, MCH, MD, PDCC, PhD, MHA and BSc degrees at the 23rd convocation of Sanjay Gandhi Post Graduate Institute of Medical Science, Governor Ram Naik asserted that it was not the completion but the beginning of a new learning phase and they should maintain a humane touch while serving and exploring new heights in their career.

As many as 162 students, including 69 girls, were given away degrees. In his address, PGI director and Prof BC Roy awardee Prof Rakesh Kapoor stated that the institute had been serving people since 1988 and had produced quality professionals over the years. "We started emergency services with seven beds and will make it to 220 beds," he said. Augmenting its services, Prof Kapoor said renal transplant would be provided in a year where two transplants would be done daily. "To provide liver transplant facility, we have bought equipment worth ₹40 crore and Dr Rajan Saxena will develop the centre," he added. Speaking on the occasion, Principal Secretary, Health, Rajnish Dubey stated that professionals would scale new heights at the institute. Dubey lauded the PGI's role in providing quality care,

research and producing professionals. In his address, Medical Education and Health Minister Ashutosh Tandon stated that people had a lot of faith in the institute and people from distant places visited there for the treatment. He added that despite problems, the institute had scaled dizzy heights and the SBI had sanctioned loans for its various projects likely to start next month. Extending his best wishes to awardees, he stated

ed that they needed to perform up to the people's expectations. Prof Rajan Saxena presented a vote of thanks.

On the occasion, 37 students of Doctorate of Medicine (DM), 16 MChs (Magister Chirurgiae); four PHDs (Doctor of Philosophy); 40 PDCCs (Post Doctoral Certificate); 19 MDs (Doctor of Medicine); 7 MHAs and 35 BSc nursing were awarded in convocation.

Woman deprived of cash in Chowk

In a daring incident, unidentified bike-borne miscreants looted a purse containing ₹25,000 from a woman who was walking down to her house in Chowk on Friday afternoon.

The gritty woman showed exemplary courage to counter the daredevilry of miscreants in order to get back her purse. In the process, she fell down on the ground and suffered bruises as she skidded on the road. As per reports, the woman, identified as Krishna Kumari of Valmiki Nagar locality (behind Mohan Meakin Limited) in Hasanganj, had gone to withdraw cash from a bank in Chowk. Around 2 pm, she left for her house and when she reached Lajpat Nagar, the miscreants accosted her and snatched her purse. The woman did not loose her heart and she tightened the hold on the purse but the miscreant driving the bike put it in the top gear. The woman dragged several feet and suffered



injuries. Investigation officer Vinesh Kumar Yadav said the woman was provided medical aid after the police came to know about the incident. "We were busy in security arrangements near the Tule Wali masjid and so the presence of force in the area was low," he explained

when asked how the miscreants sped off unchallenged. The IO said the woman had withdrawn the cash from the bank and the incident occurred between 1.30 pm and 2 pm. "There was only one miscreant involved in the crime and we have recovered his footage after scanning several CCTV cameras installed in the area," the IO added.

Circle officer Durga Prasad said that the woman lodged the complaint only on Saturday. "We investigated the case soon after the incident came to light. The family of the woman was asked to give a complaint about the incident and they did the same on Saturday," he said.

They said the police recovered a CCTV footage in which a youth was seen present inside the bank when the victim was busy in paperwork. "The same youth was seen moving on a bike and looting the cash from the victim after she reached a lone stretch of road in the locality," the sources disclosed.

Cash, mobile sets stolen from guest house

Lucknow (PNS): Thieves stole cash and six mobile sets from a guest house in Vishwas Khand locality of Gomti Nagar early Saturday morning, exposing police claims on intensive patrolling. As per reports, manager of the guesthouse (number 1/14) Tushar Singh Rathore told the police that the employees of the guesthouse were sleeping when the miscreants scaled the lobby and later committed the theft. "The incident occurred at 5 am at a time when employees were asleep. The

theft incident was recorded in the CCTV camera installed at the guesthouse," Rathore stated in his complaint. As the incident occurred in one of the VIP areas of Vishwas Khand, a police team reached the scene for investigation into the case. Later, a case was registered and sub-inspector Rajesh Singh was assigned the task to probe. "We are yet to find out any clue related to the theft. The footage of suspects had been given to the cops to trace them," he said.

The state-level special summary revision of electoral rolls began at Lucknow University on Saturday. Present on the occasion were chief electoral officer L Venkateshwarlu, Vice-Chancellor of Lucknow University SP Singh and District Magistrate Kaushal Raj Sharma. Students of Mahavir Prasad College presented *nukkad natak*s and those of Guru Nanak Dev College presented a song on the importance of elections. The DM, LU Vice-Chancellor and chief electoral officer spoke on the importance of elections and participation of voters.

Venkateshwarlu said the elections played an important role in the democratic process through which people could elect their representatives. He said that in all modern democracies, people chose their representatives.

CHIEF ELECTORAL OFFICER VENKATESHWARLU SAID THE ELECTIONS PLAYED AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN THE DEMOCRATIC PROCESS THROUGH WHICH PEOPLE COULD ELECT THEIR OWN REPRESENTATIVES

"Taking a decision on voting is a process which can be established through exchange of views and debates as well as discussions. One should contribute in a big way to the electoral process and try to involve people around us who are not interested in the electoral process and encourage them to elect their own representatives," he added. The DM said that from September 1, the exercise of

enrolling the voters had begun in the country. The main purpose of the exercise was to tell people that if their names were missing from the electoral rolls, they could get themselves enlisted, the DM said. "Youth who will turn 18 on June 1 2019 can also get themselves enlisted in the electronic rolls. Students should spread awareness amongst their friends and neighbours and urge them to participate in the electoral process," Sharma said, adding that elderly and differently-abled voters must also be urged to take part in the electoral process. He said efforts should be made to increase the voting percentage of the city. The LU Vice-Chancellor said that students were getting a unique opportunity to join the electoral process and they should approach BLOs in their areas to get themselves enrolled by filling in form 6.
