Yogi govt to legalise ban on *lal batti* culture

The Yogi government is set to legalise ban on 'lal batti culture' by bringing a legislation on the abolition of red and blue beacon light. Government spokesman and Health Minister Siddharth Nath Singh said that Government would bring an amendment in the law to ban use of red and blue beacons on government cars. This amendment will be okayed by the state Cabinet, probably in the next meeting, he told a group of reporters here on Friday.

"The ban will be enforced strictly. No one will be allowed to use red or blue beacons on their vehicles except for the exempted people and vehicles," he said. The Yogi government is, however, silent on use of hooters. Following Prime Minister Narendra Modi's directives to end 'lal batti' culture, the UP government took a decision on Thursday night to ban the use of red beacons. However, essential services like fire brigade, ambulances, armed forces and police vehicles will be exempted from the ban.

Top cops 'shielding' BJP MP Raghav Pal

Top cops of the state are trying to shield Bharatiya Janata Party Member of Parliament Raghav Lakhan Pal, who not only violated government orders and took out Aambedkar Shobha Yatra on Thursday but also led protesters to the local district police chief's house in Saharanpur and vandalised his residence.

The local police registered a case in the matter reportedly naming the MP but took no action against trouble-makers as majority of them were from the ruling party. However, the Uttar Pradesh IPS Officers' Association reacted strongly and reportedly twitted that such incidents badly hit the morale of cops and if the government would not react strongly, it would send wrong message amongst the men in khaki.

"The Saharanpur police had registered a case against BJP leader Vipin Ghasoti, and others, including the BJP

MP, in connection with the violence at SSP Saharanpur's residence," claimed DGP's office on Friday evening.

However, they maintained that no one was arrested in the matter and that further investigations were on. Interestingly, the local police had to register a case against the saffron leaders just as one of the CCTVs, installed in a shop near SSP's residence, captured footage of the miscreants.

SSP, Saharanpur, Luv Kumar said that a case was registered in connection with the violence and that action would be initiated against trouble makers after identifying them with the help of CCTV footage. He claimed that a heavy police was patrolling in the area to maintain peace. Sources said that though the local police registered a case yet top administrative bosses sitting directed the local administration to hush up the matter as it would only bring trouble for saffron leaders and might lead to further unrest in the district.

CISH focus on Pepino as it controls diabetes

The Central Institute of Subtropical Horticulture is trying to focus on one of the crops of Solanaceae family called Pepino which is a neglected crop. The fruit helps in the control of diabetes by providing energy and dietary fibre like oatmeal, which helps in lowering cholesterol and is also simple to digest.

CISH director Shaileendra Rajan said they were working on how the planting material should be prepared for the farmers and how it could be propagated. Pepino are fleshy berries which weigh between 100 and 700 grams. They are

yellow in colour and round in shape. "It has an acidic, mild flavour, mildly-sweet like an aromatic berry. Most of the people compare them to muskmelons. The pepino is entirely edible, including its skin and seeds, and the taste is something which is a cross between a pear and a banana," he said.

He further pointed out that the fruit was known best for its medicinal applications and could stop the progression of diabetes due to its anti-inflammatory and antioxidant effects.

"A medium serving (~100g) of its fruit provides 80 calories of energy and 5 grams of dietary fibre similar to oat-

meal, which helps in lowering cholesterol and is also simple to digest. The fibre also helps in constipation and it brings relief to gastric ulcers too. The fruit is rich in minerals and vitamin C but low in starch and sugars and does not contain oxalates. The minerals which it contains are iron, zinc, copper, manganese and calcium. It has been seen that the level of glucose and fructose decreases during ripening, whereas sucrose concentration increases as the ripening progresses. Pepino is known as a source of beta carotene, 27 mg per 100 grams of fruit flesh. The crop is also considered as a sucrose accumulator at the final ripen-

DM inspects Civil Hospital

District Magistrate Gauri Shankar Priyadarshi on Friday conducted a surprise inspection at Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Civil Hospital and asked the hospital staff to make it a work station rather than a rest room.

The DM reached the hospital at around 11 in the morning and interacted with patients and their attendants. The DM detected several irregularities in the hospital and asked the administration to ensure corrective measures in 15 days.

On reaching nursing room in one of the wards, Priyadarshi saw a bed lying there. "What purpose does this bed serve? Do nurses and other staff come to hospital to take rest? The hospital staff should make efforts to make this hospital a work station," he said.

The DM went to the OPD in the Orthopaedic department and sought patients' feedback. He later reached the Respiratory Medicine department and saw branded medicines on the table of Dr Ram Chandra Prasad. He warned the hospital administration against supply of medicines from outside.

He also inspected testing equipment in the Ophthalmology department and said the hospital should also provide spectacles to patients after required tests. He directed the hospital authorities to remove the rusting almirahs and tables and ensure adequate facilities to the patients.

The DM noticed equipment required for diagnosis of oral cavity lying idle as also defunct equipment in the ENT department. "These equipment are non-functional and the same should not be occupying space in the hospital. Make arrangements for replacements soon," the DM told the hospi-

tal authorities. While interacting with patients, he came to know that some doctors in the Dermatology department prescribed medicines from medical stores outside. The DM directed the hospital administration to probe the allegations made against the doctors.

Mutilated body found on railway track

The mutilated body of a 42-year old man was recovered from railway track between Malhar and Dilkusha stations falling on Friday. The body was spotted by gateman Bablu who informed police.

A suicide note was recovered in which the deceased wrote in Hindi that no one should be held responsible for his death and that he was ending his life without being forced by anyone. "Vimal, take care of Divya and make sure she gets proper education so that she has a bright future," the note read. However, his relation with Divya or Vimal is still unknown even as police tried to trace his family.

The investigating officer said the suicide note might also be a conspiracy by someone to misguide the police. Meanwhile, 35-year-old Vimal Dixit of New Kashiram Colony hanged himself in his room where he had been living on rent for the past seven years with wife and daughter. The body was found hanging by Vimal's wife on Friday morning and she informed his brother Kaushal Dixit, who lives in a separate house in

Mayapuram, Para. No suicide was recovered from the room while Kaushal also failed to find any motive. Vimal was working as a salesman for a shop dealing in cattle feed. He is survived by wife and 8-year-old daughter, who is a student of class II.
