Man found murdered

Lucknow (PNS): A middle-aged man was found murdered at his house in Saadatganj on Wednesday morning. As per reports, Badri Vishal (55) lived in Hasanganj Bawli locality. He had rented out a portion of his house to one Kuldeep Yadav to run a fair price shop several years back. Badri was unmarried and lived alone in the house.

On Wednesday morning, Badri's acquaintances reached his house to enquire about his well-being after he did not wake up on Wednesday morning, and found him dead.

His hands were tied behind and there were bruises around his throat. It seemed that the miscreants tied his hands before strangling him to death, sources said. On being informed, Badri's brother-in-law Bharat Lal Sahu, along with his family, reached the place and later lodged a case of murder against unidentified persons.

During investigations, it surfaced that Badri was not on good terms with his brothers and sisters who live in Saadatganj. Police said a number of people used to visit Badri's house and stay there till late night. Police said a case of murder was registered in this connection and those who would frequent the house of the deceased had been detained for interrogation. The cops hoped that the case would be worked out soon.

Neighbours suspected Badri might have been killed by some of his close acquaintances. "Those who visited Badri's house used to stay there late night. Badri was also not on good terms with his neighbours as they were not impressed by his lifestyle," a local resident said.

₹2.5-lakh dacoity case worked out; 6 arrested

With the arrest of six persons on Wednesday, police claimed to have worked out the dacoity case in which a factory owner was attacked and robbed of Rs 2.5 lakh on the night of July 23.

A resident of Rajajipuram, the victim, Rajesh Kumar Gupta, owns an iron rods factory. Those arrested were identified as Vivek Sonkar of Alambagh, Rahul Shukla and Adarsh Verma (both of Thakurganj), Khurshed and Ravi Pasi (both of Talkatora) and Vipin Kumar of Para. Pawan, one of their aides, is still absconding. The cops recovered Rs 1.12 lakh, the scooty owned by Rajesh, two motorcycles and five mobiles sets from the possession of the miscreants. Ravi Pasi was said to be the mastermind behind the dacoity while Vivek used to work at Rajesh's factory. After leaving his job several months back, Vivek joined the gang led by Ravi. He tipped off Ravi about Rajesh Gupta's per-day cash transaction. On the information, Ravi chalked out a plan to target Rajesh.

As per plan, the miscreants assembled a few furlongs away from Rajesh's factory on the fateful day. Vivek, who was hanging around the factory, immediately informed his aides about Rajesh's movement.

Rahul and Adarsh, who were on a bike, started trailing Rajesh and hit his scooty from behind when he reached Nidhi Steel Factory. After Rajesh fell down, Vipin, Khurshed and Pawan also reached the spot. They attacked



Rajesh, inflicting injuries on his head, and collected the cash he had kept in his scooty's box. They also looted his scooty and fled the scene. The gang then reached Ravi's hideout where they handed over the cash to him. Pawan took Rs 1.12 lakh while Ravi kept the remaining amount with him. SSP Manzil Saini said the police team was working on the case got a lead about the miscreants after scanning footages of CCTVs installed in the area. She said a joint team of Crime Branch and Talkatora police cracked the case. The SSP announced a cash prize of Rs 5,000 for the police team.

Interestingly, on the day of incident, the police had claimed that road hold-up was a handiwork of two miscreants. The cops were initially skeptical about victim's claims and had even questioned him over the cash he was carrying.

Narrow escape for 3 sisters

Lucknow (PNS): Three sisters going to their schools had a providential escape when a speeding van hit their cycle in Gudamba on Wednesday morning. The girls suffered injuries and were admitted to hospital. The commuters later nabbed the van driver and handed him over to police.

As per reports, Rajesh Pal of Jankipuram (sector-F) works at a private school. His elder daughter Maya Pal (17) studies in Class XII at Rajkiya Inter College in Vikas Nagar while two younger daughters Anshika (6) and Vanshika (7) study in a private school at Sahara Estate in Jankipuram.

Maya and her sisters were going to their schools on a cycle. Maya routinely dropped her sisters to their school before going to her school.

Around 7 am on Wednesday, when the sisters reached near Vijaya Bank branch in Jankipuram, a speeding school van hit their cycle from behind, as a result of which the girls suffered injuries on their legs, hands and heads.

Vanshika and Anshika became unconscious while Maya started weeping. Commuters flocked to the scene and rushed the victims to hospital.

Vanshika and Anshika later regained their consciousness. The girls were said to be traumatised following the mishap. Police arrested the van driver, identified as Ashfaq of Adil Nagar in Gudamba, and sent him to jail.

Student's death at hospital: Parents submit statements

Parents of a Class V student of St Francis' School, who died allegedly after being administered wrong injection, submitted their statements, assuring them a formal enquiry into the incident. After the hospital administration did little in the matter, the parents approached police, who showed a Supreme Court ruling and passed the baton to senior officials.

Even the senior officials did little despite repeated pleas of the hapless parents. After the distraught parents appealed to the Governor and Chief Minister, senior officials of the Health department set up a committee comprising three doctors of SPM Hospital to probe the death.

The committee concluded that the child was suffering from a disorder which resulted in clotting in his brain leading to his death.

Dissatisfied with the slow pace of inquiry, the aggrieved parents said that despite their appeal, the administration refused to conduct autopsy. They also alleged that the hospital administration was trying to save the erring doctor.

Learning about the demise of their child, parents and other attendants created a ruckus on the hospital campus. Later, the hospital administration intervened and pacified the grief-stricken parents, assuring them a formal enquiry into the incident. After the hospital administration did little in the matter, the parents approached police, who showed a Supreme Court ruling and passed the baton to senior officials.

Even the senior officials did little despite repeated pleas of the hapless parents. After the distraught parents appealed to the Governor and Chief Minister, senior officials of the Health department set up a committee comprising three doctors of SPM Hospital to probe the death.

The committee concluded that the child was suffering from a disorder which resulted in clotting in his brain leading to his death.

Missing boys recovered from Varanasi

The two missing boys — Abhishek and Aditya — were recovered from Varanasi on Wednesday after Abhishek called his mother and informed her about his location. He also told his mother he was with Aditya and they fled the house to go on a trip.

SO, Jankipuram, Gopal Yadav said the police contacted the GRP in Varanasi and the boys were recovered. He said the boys had taken Rs 1,000 each from their houses.

"After they ran out of cash, they dropped their journey. Later, Abhishek contacted his family and it was how police came to know about their location," he said.

On Tuesday, both Aditya Dwivedi (13) of Jankipuram Vistar and Abhishek Verma (13) had left their houses on their cycles and reached Engineering College crossing where they unsuccessfully tried to sell their cycles.

Later, they reached Badshah Nagar railway station where parked their cycles and boarded a train.

Aditya is a student of St Anthony School in Jankipuram while Abhishek studies in Pioneer Montessori School.

Aditya's father died some time back and his mother Reena Dwivedi is a PWD employee. Abhishek's father Mithilesh of Rampur locality in Jankipuram works at a private shop in Aliganj.
